

Trails to Schnebly Hill Road and I-17

This route will bring you to the upper end of Schnebly Hill Rd. If you have the time, continue across I-17 and take this scenic drive down in to the red rocks of Sedona, AZ. It is a spectacular drive.

The trail system again ranges from easy to fairly technical, especially near the "Burn Area". It is clearly evident what fire and subsequent erosion do to the trail system. FS228 became very rocky, with exposed roots and mud holes to contend with. Of course this may not be the case later in the year.

At one point, where FS91 meets up with an old rail bed, the trial is spectacular. The rail bed means smooth, with an occasional surprise set of whoops, riding. The canopy of trees adds to the riding quality.

As FS228 meets FS226 you are back on a wide gravel road. You will begin to see more people on this road and eventually..."civilization" I-17!
